# 6.1 Resolution supporting the fight against the spread of invasive exotic plants

**WHEREAS** lakes and streams represent a collective wealth to be protected throughout the province of Quebec;

**WHEREAS** the inputs and release of nutrients, including phosphorus and nitrogen, are one of the causes of degradation of water quality and the proliferation of aquatic plants and algae;

WHEREAS the council is of the opinion that it is in the interest of the municipality and its taxpayers that all possible measures be taken to contribute to the preservation of the quality of our lakes;

**WHEREAS** that the effects of Eurasian watermilfoil in recent years have been compounded by the presence of other invasive exotic plants in both aquatic or terrestrial environments, including giant hogweed and Japanese knotweed;

**WHEREAS** the municipality is particularly worried about the presence of giant hogweed on the MRC des Laurentides territory because of the public health problem it may pose for its citizens;

**WHEREAS** measures must be taken to prevent the spread and promote the eradication of invasive exotic species;

**WHEREAS** the presence of invasive exotic species in the vicinity of the properties becomes an economic argument taken into consideration during the property assessment which could potentially have a significant impact on our financial health;

**WHEREAS** the support of the Government of Quebec is insufficient to this scourge by having assigned only one person to deal with invasive exotic species for the whole province of Quebec;

WHEREAS that the municipality considers that the spread of giant

hogweed and other invasive exotic plants is a problem that goes beyond the administrative boundaries of its territory and that it is necessary to request the participation of the Ministry of Sustainable Development, Environment and the Fight against Climate Change (MDDELCC);

# CONSEQUENTLY,

It is moved by councillor Dale Rathwell

**TO REQUEST** the MRC des Laurentides to take the necessary steps to request the MDDELCC to make the necessary financial and human resources available to the municipalities of Quebec so that all these regions can obtain the necessary financial and technical support for the protection of its water bodies and streams and their entire territory, to eliminate the proliferation of all types of invasive exotic plants;

**TO TRANSMIT** this resolution to Mr. Yves Saint-Denis, member of Parliament, the Quebec Federation of Municipalities (FQM), the Union of Municipalities of Quebec (UMQ), the MRC of Pays d'en Haut and Antoine-Labelle and other municipalities of the MRC des Laurentides, and the Association Lake Beaven & Lac Rond for their support.

# **6.2 Linear Regional Park - Removable Occupancy Management Request**

**WHEREAS** on October 20<sup>th</sup>, 2016, the MRC des Laurentides passed a resolution asking the Ministry of Transport, Sustainable Mobility and Transport Electrification to transfer to the MRC, for its territory, the granting of occupancy permits to "removable" work located on the right-of-way of Le P'tit Train du nord Linear Park;

WHEREAS that the removable work correspond to work and constructions that can be easily removed from the right-of-way of the regional linear parks Le P'tit Train du nord and Aerobic Corridor (wharf, above-ground stairway, landscaping, pedestrian crossing), which work and construction represent a low risk for the ministry;

**WHEREAS** that a number of occupancy requests sent by the MRC to the ministry for processing remain, for the majority of them, unanswered for more than one year, more than the 60 days provided in particular for the lease between the MRC des Laurentides and the ministry, on July 5<sup>th</sup>, 1994, for the management of the former railway right-of-way designated as "Le P'tit Train du nord";

**WHEREAS** a lease was also signed between the MRC des Laurentides and the ministry on October 31<sup>st</sup>, 1996, for the management of the former railway right-of-way designated as the "Aerobic Corridor";

**WHEREAS** the MRC des Laurentides has the field knowledge and the resources to ensure the efficient management of occupations of the park right-of-way on its territory;

**WHEREAS** the Municipality of Arundel supports the request of the MRC des Laurentides made by its resolution 2016.10.6988 adopted October 20<sup>th</sup>, 2016;

#### CONSEQUENTLY,

It is moved by councillor Hervey William Howe

And carried:

**TO ASK** the Ministry of Transport, Sustainable Mobility and Transport Electrification:

- **TO** grant to the MRC des Laurentides, for the rights-of-way of Le P'tit Train du nord linear parks and the Aerobic Corridor on its territory, the granting of occupancy permits relating to removable works, to maintain the responsibility of the ministry for the granting of occupations having a real permanent character, such as vehicular crossings, underground infrastructures, rights of way, as provided for in the leases entered into between the parties;
- **TO** delegate a resource to the ministry to settle the various requests that have remained unanswered for more than 60 days, in the event that it was not possible to surrender, in the short term, the granting of permissions for removable occupations at the MRC des Laurentides.

6.3 SPAI – 79, Village Street – Exterior siding – Roll number 1893-33-3357

**WHEREAS** a request under the SPAI has been submitted for the property located at 79, Village Street and which is identified by the roll number 1893-33-3357 and is aimed at changing the exterior siding and windows;

**WHEREAS** the request of the owners is subject to the criteria of Bylaw # 168 concerning the Site Planning and Architectural Integration Program (SPAI);

**WHEREAS** the applicants have filed the plans and elevations of the building, as well as a sample of the exterior siding;

**WHEREAS** the coating material is CanExel walnut, color recommended under the SPAI;

**WHEREAS** the Planning Advisory Committee's recommendation to accept this request;

And carried that the council accepts the request submitted under the SPAI for the property located at 79, Village Street and which is identified by the roll number 1893-33-3357 and aims to change the exterior siding and windows of the building according to the plans and elevations filed.

6.4 Vehicular crossing via the Aerobic Corridor to serve the vacant property – Roll number 1792-19-9062

**WHEREAS** the request of the owners to have the vehicular access to their property recognized (vacant lot number 15-76 of range 3 which crosses the Aerobic Corridor to join lot 15-84 of range 3, then the Doctor-Henry road (notarized servitude in the deed # 50182 of November 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1938);

**WHEREAS** that the Ministry of Recreation of Hunting and Fishing had, on May 16<sup>th</sup>, 1992, granted by formal letter, the right to the owners to cross, and even to circulate by car on the Aerobic Corridor over a distance of about 900 meters between the bridge leading to Huberdeau and their property (westbound);

**WHEREAS** there is no other vehicular access within one kilometer of the projected eastbound access;

**WHEREAS** the owners have been operating since 1983 on this property an outdoor recreation business including a wild camping site accompanied by initiation courses for canoeing and kayaking;

**WHEREAS** the use has never been added to the assessment roll of the MRC des Laurentides despite continued operation since 1983, probably because the on-site facilities are very basic (dry pit cabinet and gazebo);

**WHEREAS** the MRC des Laurentides acts as the manager of the linear parks following agreements signed with the Government of Quebec and that the municipalities have had to comply with the interim control bylaw concerning Le P'tit Train du Nord regional parks and the Aerobic Corridor (261-2011) effective January 27<sup>th</sup>, 2012;

WHEREAS the MRC des Laurentides conducted a GPS survey of the existing accesses in Arundel in the fall of 2013 and prepared a plan illustrating all these existing accesses as well as projected accesses (6 new accesses, excluding the one in question);

**WHEREAS** the survey carried out in 2013 mentions an access for off-road vehicles (ORV) to be removed at this location;

# CONSEQUENTLY,

It is moved by councillor Jonathan Morgan

And carried to recommend to the Council of mayors to endorse the request of the Municipality of Arundel for the modification of the Aerobic Corridor occupancy table – Arundel sector, in order to recognize this vehicular intersection as existing by modifying the note in the table which currently indicates "Vehicular Crossing (ORV)? - date of development unknown new house built in 2013 on land on the other side of the road (63, Dr. Henry) - To remove access ORV " for the following note" Unpaved vehicular crossing giving access to a wild camping site on Lot-15-76 - "Retain" and that a permit of occupation be issued by the MRC, so that the municipality is able to add to the assessment roll the commercial use that it has.

**WHEREAS** since its opening in 1950, the Saint-Jérôme Regional Hospital has continued its mission of providing health care and services in response to the needs of the population of greater Saint-Jérôme and the entire administrative region of the Laurentians, and this, as a regional hospital;

**WHEREAS** the population of the Laurentians was 319,000 people in 1986 and in 2017, it reached more than 609,441 people. In 2025, the population will be 670,000 people according to the Quebec Institute of Statistics;

**WHEREAS** the Saint-Jérôme Regional Hospital serves all of the Laurentian MRC's with a wide range of medical and surgical specialties to offer the population numerous specialized services in the region;

**WHEREAS** it has been established that the Laurentian region has been underfunded by the Québec government in the health field for several years, considering population growth and aging;

**WHEREAS** on December 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2017, the Centre intégré de santé et de services sociaux des Laurentides submitted a modernization and

expansion project for the Saint-Jérôme Regional Hospital totaling \$ 400 million to the Ministry of Health and Social Services of Quebec;
