**WHEREAS** each participating municipality has a by-law respecting burning or relating to outdoor fires and should be replaced by a common by-law to the whole territory of the Régie in order to ensure a uniform regulation;

**THAT** this resolution is immediate and revokes any other mandate previously granted, without further notice.

**WHEREAS** that the installation of fencing along the right-of-way of the bridge would make access to the land more difficult at this point:

**WHEREAS** the investigation report of Coroner Julie A. Blondin concerning the death of Mr. Benjamin-Albert Montplaisir-Lessard, who recommends that the Ministère des Transports, de la Mobilité durable et de l'Électrification des Transports du Québec secure the portion of land which it owns by affixing a security barrier to restrict people's access to the Rouge River;

## CONSEQUENTLY,

**WHEREAS** that the minimum capital threshold to be maintained for the duration of the program is \$83,160, or \$28 per capita per year, or a total of \$140 per inhabitant for all five years of the program;

**WHEREAS** that the Municipality has read the guide on the terms and conditions for the payment of the government contribution under the Gas Tax and Québec Contribution Program (TECQ) for the years 2014 to 2018;

WHEREAS that the municipality must respect the terms of this guide that apply to it to receive the government contribution confirmed to it in a letter from the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy;

**WHEREAS** that once a year before October 15<sup>th</sup> the municipality is required to file a revised work schedule specifying and confirming the work carried out before September 30<sup>th</sup> of the current year and indicating its estimate of expenses for eligible work which it plans to carry out between October 1<sup>st</sup> of the current year and March 31<sup>st</sup> of the following year;

## CONSEQUENTLY,

**THAT** the municipality undertakes to respect the terms of the guide that apply to it;

**THAT** the municipality undertakes to be solely responsible and to indemnify Canada, Quebec and their ministers, officers, employees and agents from and against any and all claims, demands, losses, damages and costs of any kind, having as a basis an injury to a person, death, damage to property or loss of property attributable to a willful or negligent act resulting directly or indirectly from investments made with the financial assistance obtained within the framework of the TECQ 2014-2018 program;

**THAT** the municipality approve the content and authorize the sending to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy the revised work schedule dated September 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2017 and all other documents required by the Ministère to receive the government contribution which was confirmed in a letter from the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy;

**THAT** the municipality undertake to reach the minimum threshold of fixed assets in municipal infrastructures set at \$ 28 per capita per year, for a total of \$ 140 per inhabitant for all five years of the program;

**THAT** the Municipality undertakes to inform the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Land Occupancy of any modification that will be made to the work schedule approved by this resolution;

**THAT** the Municipality certifies by this resolution that the revised work program of September 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2017, includes true realized costs and reflects the projected expenses of the eligible work until March 31<sup>st</sup>.
