## LOAN BY-LAW #193 APPLYING FOR A LOAN OF 1 600 000\$ FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW MUNICIPAL GARAGE

**WHEREAS** the Municipality wishes to refurbish the municipal garage and infrastructure;

WHEREAS the municipality has submitted a grant application for the refurbishment of the municipal garage and that the application has been approved by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and land use;

**WHEREAS** all council members declare having read the following bylaw and waive the reading of it;

**WHEREAS** a notice of motion of this by-law was duly given at the council meeting held June 12th, 2014;

## CONSEQUENTLY,

Council enacts as follows:

### **ARTICLE 1**

The preamble is an integral part of this by-law.

#### **ARTICLE 2**

The council is authorized to perform or enforce construction of a new municipal garage, including a community hall, the dismantling of the former municipal garage and rehabilitation of the land, at 60 Morrison Road, according to the plans and specifications prepared by Jean Damecour, architect, and the evaluation budget prepared by the Director General, dated June 5th, 2014, which is an integral part of this by-law, as Annex "A".

#### **ARTICLE 3**

To this end, the council is authorized to borrow an amount of 1,600,000\$ over a period not exceeding 40 years.

#### **ARTICLE 4**

The council sets the reduction of the loan under this by-law, any contribution or grant which may be paid for the payment of part or all of the expenditure declared by this by-law.

The council also affects the payment of part or all of the debt service, any grant payable over several years. The repayment term of the loan in the amount of the grant will be adjusted automatically to the time fixed for the payment of the subsidy in the case of a reduction of the term of this by-law.

#### **ARTICLE 5**

In the event that the amount authorized by this by-law is higher than the amount spent in relation to this allocation, the council is authorized to use the excess to pay any expenditure under this by-law and for which the allocation was deemed insufficient.

## ARTICLE 6

To cover the expenses incurred for interest and capital repayment of annual payments of the loan, it is by this by-law imposed and levied annually during the term of the loan, on all taxable property in the territory of the municipality, a special tax at a rate sufficient according to their value as shown on the assessment roll in force each year.

## ARTICLE 7

This by-law shall enter into force in accordance with the law

6.1 Intervention request for the protection of our lakes

**WHEREAS** the environment is recognized by the Quebec government under the Act skills (RSQ, C-47.1) expertise;

WHEREAS municipalities must compose in a legal context making it almost impossible between the obligations imposed by the Act of 2001 Merchant Marine Act, SC 2001, c. 26 (federal) and provincial environmental laws;

**WHEREAS** the Local Authorities' Restriction Guide on Boating, places such cumbersome procedures and general objectives so that it becomes almost impossible to allow a municipality to act in its field of competence, namely the environment;

**WHEREAS** the draft of the new local government guide on Restriction Regulations for the use of buildings demonstrates an equally insurmountable burden while indicating that it is "the last resort to solve problems";

**WHEREAS** the state of the case law does not yet allow to distinguish between an intervention aimed at environmental protection under provincial jurisdiction and maritime transport under federal jurisdiction;

**WHEREAS** the request for intervention in the Municipality of Val-des-Lacs;

WHEREAS the need to act on our water plans to protect its survival;
