5.3 Mandate airborne LiDAR survey system - 3D Mosaic Group Géniearp

WHEREAS the Municipality of Arundel adopted in August 2013 bylaw #174 concerning the establishment of a local fund reserved for the repairs and maintenance of certain public roads;

WHEREAS to meet the needs of the fund, a fee is payable by each operator of a quarry or sand pit, located on the territory of the municipality and whose operation is likely to result in transit through municipal public roads of substances specified in the second paragraph;

WHEREAS the fee payable by an operator is calculated based on the amount, expressed in metric tons or cubic meters, processed or not, substances that pass from its site and are surface mineral substances defined in Section 1 of the Mining Act (RSQ, chapter M-13.1) or substances from the recycling of demolition debris of buildings, bridges, roads or other structures;

WHEREAS that the owner of a site of a quarry or sand pit located on the territory of the municipality must file a return, as provided by the by-law #174;

WHEREAS the municipality can judge the accuracy of a statement described under by-law #174 by taking an aerial photo of the quarry site or quarry and its analysis by a calculation method which allows to assess the quantity of substances extracted and an inspection of the quarry site or quarry by an officer or employee or agent of the municipality;

WHEREAS that the Group Géniearp 3D Mosaic filed an offer of services for the production of an airborne survey by LiDAR control system with GPS in order to create a digital terrain model in 3D setting the day of the survey, the exact topography (+ / - 7cm) in height difference of each of the quarry sites and quarries and thus provide a 3D image for each geo-referenced survey, subsequently, serving as the basis for volumetric calculations;

CONSEQUENTLY,

And carried:

THAT council mandates the Géniearp 3D Mosaic Group to produce an airborne LiDAR system with GPS control, all according to the offer of services received March 22nd 2016 in the amount of 5 461.31 \$ including taxes;
