WHEREAS a notice of motion was given by Mayor Pascale Blais at the regular Council meeting of May 17, 2022, in accordance with Article 445 of the Municipal Code;

WHEREAS in accordance with section 445 of the Quebec Municipal Code, copies of the draft bylaw 271 are available to the public at this council meeting and are hereby tabled;

WHEREAS the revised urban plan of the municipality, dating from 2002, is no longer adapted in many aspects to the new realities of development on the territory of Arundel, especially since the pandemic, which has generated new significant pressures on real estate development on the territory

WHEREAS the 1st draft of the new revised Land Use and Development Plan (SADT) of the MRC des Laurentides adopted on August 19, 2021, by virtue of its resolution number 2021.08.8461 and revising the plan dating from June 2000, will introduce a new perspective of planned development on the territory of the MRC including that of Arundel, as well as tools to achieve this, which will be better adapted to the new realities of development of the territory of Arundel;

WHEREAS the 2nd draft of this new SADT as well as its final draft should be adopted at the earliest in the fall of 2022, if not during the year 2023, and that the municipality will then have to modify its urban plan and its urban planning bylaws to make them consistent with the new SADT;

WHEREAS the municipality cannot wait for the adoption of the new SADT to initiate minimal changes, in order to ensure the realization of its major orientation #5 of the 2022 council in terms of development of the territory and preservation of its natural heritage including its landscapes

WHEREAS in the meantime the municipality must acquire basic planning tools for the territory corresponding to its new reality and that it is entitled to modify its Urban Plan under sections 109 and following of the LAU for this purpose

WHEREAS the modification of the density of some of the major land uses of the Arundel Urban Plan would make it possible to safeguard its rights, while awaiting the coming into force of the new final SADT of the Laurentian MRC and then to carry out a thorough and more generalized review of the Urban Plan and all of its urban planning regulations;

WHEREAS council is very concerned about preserving the rural character, the exceptional beauty of its landscapes and the richness of its natural environment and wishes, through this amendment, to avoid

urban sprawl, to protect its eco-corridors that cross the territory and to put in place a vision and allow a planned development of the territory of Arundel before it is too late.

WHEREAS, under the Municipal Code of Quebec, a municipality may subscribe to a group insurance contract for the benefit of its officials and employees, the contract holder being the FQM;

WHEREAS the Contract came into force on January 1, 2022

WHEREAS the Contract is automatically renewable every year;

THAT this resolution in no way limits the right of the FQM to revoke its designated representatives and substitute another;

THAT this resolution is immediate and revokes any other resolution previously granted on the same subject as this resolution, without further notice.

9.2 New agreement for the provision of First Responder services - authorization to negotiate, conclude and sign by the Mayor and Director General

WHEREAS the municipalities of Arundel, Huberdeau, Montcalm and the Town of Barkmere took advantage of articles 468 and following of the Cities and Towns Act (CTA) and articles 569 and following of the Municipal Code (MC), in 2010, to enter into an inter-municipal agreement for the provision of first responder services, which is in effect since January 1, 2011, and by virtue of which the municipality of Arundel provides first responder services to the municipalities that are parties to the agreement (hereinafter the "original agreement") the "Original Agreement");

WHEREAS the municipal councils of Arundel, Huberdeau, Montcalm and the Town of Barkmere wish to maintain such a first responder service throughout their territory to ensure the protection of their citizens:

WHEREAS it is necessary to modify the original agreement in order to make some changes to the terms and conditions for authorizing expenses in the context of joint purchase of goods and the sharing of assets and liabilities accordingly, as well as the necessary adjustments to those terms and conditions that were not provided for in the original agreement, as well as to review the methods of allocating expenses,;

WHEREAS it is necessary to adopt a new intermunicipal agreement, which would replace the original agreement, to include these modifications..

CONSEQUENTLY,

It is proposed by councillor Stéphane Carrière

And carried to:

AUTHORIZE the Mayor and the Director General to negotiate, conclude and sign a new intermunicipal agreement for the provision of first responder services between the municipalities of Arundel, Montcalm, Huberdeau and the Town of Barkmere, replacing the original 2010 agreement.

10.2 Interim control resolution on the sub-categories of use Housing (H-1, H-2, H-3, H-4, H-5, H-6 to H-7) and the sub-category of use Commerce (C-11), as well as major projects on the territory of the municipality of the Township of Arundel

WHEREAS the MRC des Laurentides has initiated the process of modifying its new revised land use and development plan (SADT) by the adoption of resolution number 2021.08.8461, on August 19, 2021

WHEREAS the municipal council of Arundel has adopted its Major orientations 2022 in order to give itself a global and structured vision of the main issues and orientations to be followed, and of which orientation 5 promotes the preservation of its natural heritage including its landscapes on its territory

WHEREAS the council of the municipality began the process of amending its Urban Plan, on May 17, 2022, by adopting draft Bylaw No. 271 amending the Urban Plan No. 110 reducing the land use densities of the PA, RU, VA and FOR allocations and targeting the H-1, H-2 and C-2 uses for a planned development of the territory

WHEREAS it is thus entitled to avail itself of sections 111 and following of the Act respecting land use planning and development (LAU) in matters of interim control;

WHEREAS the new development pressures and the need to take time to reflect and to establish appropriate planning and development tools for its territory;

WHEREAS if the municipality does not take control measures in the interim of the modification of the Urban Plan #110 and towards the new schema and its concordance obligations, it will be too late to ensure a planning and development of its territory adapted to its orientations and needs:

WHEREAS the municipality deems it imperative not to compromise in the short term the achievement of one of its fundamental objectives in terms of land use planning and sustainability, by adopting an interim control on residential and commercial uses and major projects;

CONSEQUENTLY,

It is proposed by councillor Stéphane Carrière

And carried to:

THAT in accordance with sections 112.6 and following of the Act respecting land use planning and development (RLRQ, c. A-19.1), the Council of the Municipality of Arundel provides that as of this day and until the coming into force of an interim control by-law or until the date on which this resolution ceases to have effect according to law, the Municipality of Arundel shall be subject to the interim control decreed

by this resolution; an interim control applying according to the provisions contained in the following articles:

ARTICLE 1 EFFECTS OF THIS INTERIM CONTROL

No construction or cadastral operation permit, nor any certificate of authorization or occupancy may be issued by virtue of a by-law of the Municipality of Arundel, if the activity, use, construction or building in question is subject to a prohibition under this interim control.

ARTICLE 2 INTERPRETATIVE PROVISIONS

The expressions, terms and words used in this interim control have the meaning and application attributed to them in the planning by-laws in force in the territory of the Municipality of Arundel.

ARTICLE 3 DELIMITATION OF THE TERRITORY OF APPLICATION

The provisions of this interim control resolution apply to all land within the territory of the Municipality of Arundel within the zones listed in Table 1 and identified on the plan in Appendix A and in the zoning bylaw of the Municipality of Arundel, unless otherwise indicated.

ARTICLE 4 PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO INTERIM CONTROL

Within the territory of application of the Municipality of Arundel, the following are prohibited

- 1. The municipality prohibits new land uses, new constructions and expansions, demolitions, applications for cadastral operations and subdivisions of lots made by alienation, which prohibitions apply to subcategories H-2 "three-family dwelling", H-3 "multi-family dwelling", H-4 "common dwelling" and H-7 "mobile home park", of the "Dwelling" use class, as well as to subcategory C-11 " commercial accommodation", of the "Commercial" use class;
- 2. The municipality prohibits new land uses, new constructions and expansions, demolitions, applications for cadastral operations and subdivisions of lots made by alienation, related to an activity that is part of any major project of the image plan type, where the number of lots to be formed is greater than five (5) or that includes one or more new streets or a park, or which will be the subject of a declaration of co-ownership pursuant to Article 1038 and following of the Civil Code of Québec or which includes an integrated housing project where the number of lots to be formed is greater than five (5), which prohibitions apply to subcategories H-1 "single-family dwelling", H-2 "two-family dwelling", H-5 "integrated housing project" and H-6 "mobile home", of the "Dwelling" use category.



WHEREAS the orientation #5 of the 2022 Council's major orientations, adopted on January 2022, ensuring that its citizens live in a beautiful, healthy and livable environment, and to favor a development of the territory that preserves its natural heritage.
