A Word from the Mayor

Following the rehabilitation of de la Montagne and White Roads in 2021 and 2022, it is now time for the much needed rehabilitation of Rouge Road, as well as Grace Road in order to rectify its water flow problems, mainly with the help of the TECQ 2019–2023 program, as well as the municipal building and its affordable housing for seniors. The purchase of a new truck (ambulance) to meet the needs of our intermunicipal first responder service is also planned. These projects are not new and their realization is long overdue.

The new normative measures for a planned development of the territory, as initiated in May 2022 by the modification of the urban plan of the municipality of Arundel, have recently come into effect, through a summary revision of certain land use densities and the implementation of planning tools and flexibility criteria, in order to ensure a progressive and socially acceptable development of the territory, if applicable. In the coming months, the public will be asked to consider the issue of short-stay rentals in primary residences.

The new council elected in 2021 and the team of municipal employees, most of whom were renewed in 2022, are working diligently to carry out these and other priority projects in 2023.

Only canvas, synthetic canvas or any other similar covering and only canvas, synthetic fabric or other similar covering and removable painted panels are accepted as covering. This covering must be of uniform color, without stain and without perforation.


It is important to verify if a building permit is required before undertaking any type of work.

Positioning of Wheeled Bins



Best practices for the various collections:

- Put your bins out the day before
- The bins must be placed at the curb, inside the private entrance
- A one-meter perimeter must be cleared around the bin
- No vehicle should be parked near the bin

A building number is not only a decorative or useful element for the post office. A visible number allows emergency services to quickly locate a building. Knowing that every second and every minute counts in an emergency situation, it is important to ensure that your building number is clearly visible.
